WunderRadio (\$9.99; www.wunderradio.com) from Weather Underground is an Internet radio station app that lets you search more than 400 location and genre-defined stations from RadioTime. Paired with your BlackBerry's GPS, the app can help you find local stations, and business travelers may appreciate that they can check weather conditions from local NOAA (National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration) radio streams.

New Titles For Windows Mobile

The newest version of Diginonymous' **DigiGone Secure Mobile** (contact Diginonymous for pricing; www.diginonymous.com) includes encrypted video teleconferencing for Windows Mobile 5/6 devices. Now, in addition to encrypted voice, instant messaging, and file transfer, the software provides AES 256-bit encryption for mobile-to-mobile and mobile-to-PC video calls between two or more parties.

If you're a fan of WeatherBug on your desktop, you'll want to download **WeatherBug Mobile** (\$14.95; www.weatherbug.com). You can check out live and local forecasts from more than 8,000 neighborhood WeatherBug Weather Stations, and severe weather alerts are sent in real time. Alerts are specific to your ZIP code and include an Issued and Expired field. In terms of local content, there's animated local radar as well as live and time-lapse images from weather cameras.

An updated version of SPB Software's **SPB Time** (\$14.95; www.spbsoftware.com) improves upon the alarm features and world clock built into Windows Mobile. New in SPB Time 3.0 is the inclusion of three alarm types, so you can set multiple alerts to suit your needs. The new Paranoid and Bio alarms are designed to wake up deep and light sleepers, respectively. The interface was also re-designed to be more accessible and run faster than version 2.0.

New Titles For webOS

Business executives who rely upon *Forbes* for the latest news, analysis, and opinions should download **Forbes.com For webOS** (free; www.forbes.com). You'll have access to the latest editorial channels, such as Markets and Personal Finance as well as news from

the CMO Network, Intelligent Investing, and ForbesWoman sections. *Forbes.com* For webOS also features a customizable My Stocks area and a Prepare For Offline function, so you can download articles for later reading—a handy feature for frequent flyers. The application integrates the ability to email or share content among services such as Buzz, Digg, Facebook, Redditt, and Yahoo!.

Google Voice is a Web-based phone call forwarding/screening service that lets you set up one number for all your phone's and regulate who and when callers can reach your personal and work numbers. **gDial Pro** (free; gdialpro.com) provides a way for you to call contacts or send text messages via your Google Voice number instead of your mobile phone number. Other helpful features include the ability to view a Google Voice call, text, and voicemail history.

Foxtail Software's **Mileage Monitor** (free beta; foxtailsoftware.com) is a webOS app that can help you determine your vehicle's fuel efficiency. To use Mileage Monitor, tap the New Tank icon and enter your vehicle's tank size, how much it costs to fill up, and your vehicle's odometer numbers. You'll see how efficiently your car burned through the last tank of gas, and you can compare that to the results since you've begun entering data.

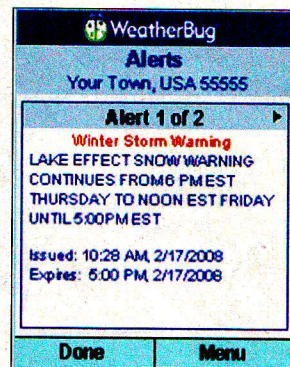
New Titles For Multiple Platforms

SmrtGuard (\$3.99 per month; www.smrtguard.com) is a security app for BlackBerry and Android mobile phones. You can remotely wipe your phone, including the memory card, and SmrtGuard will uninstall some applications. You can also use SmrtGuard to track your phone, remotely lock, and listen to the audio of the environment surrounding the phone from another phone. SmrtGuard lets you remotely export your phone's data for backup; in case of failure, you can restore it from the SmrtGuard Web Portal.

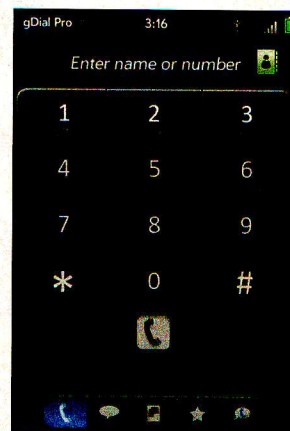
Need an app to simplify your social networking contacts? **Seismic for BlackBerry** (free; seismic.com) arranges your Twitter feeds in a timeline so you can enter keywords to follow searches through your timeline. **Seismic For Android** (free) offers similar features as well as the ability to share photos, videos, and locations via sharing Web sites such as TwitPic and YouTube.
